Attention all veterans and veteran supporters who work for the state of Indiana! The Indiana Department of Veterans Affairs (IDVA) is excited to announce a new Employee Resource Group (ERG).

What is an ERG? Employee Resource Groups are voluntary, employee-led groups promoting diversity and inclusion. They inherently provide support, enhance career development, and contribute to personal development. These groups are led by employees who share characteristics such as gender, ethnicity, lifestyle, or a common interest.



This ERG will be the forefront of resources and networking opportunities for state employees who are currently serving or have served in the military, and employees who support the veteran community. This veteran ERG will include and promote the ideas brought forth by those within the group.

Joining this resource group is voluntary and will be supported by an executive sponsor. Dennis Wimer, Director of the Indiana Department of Veterans Affairs, will honorably serve as the initial executive sponsor. The group will be led by Indiana state employees currently serving or who have served in any branch of the U.S. Armed Forces.

The first organizational meeting will convene in September 2023. Monthly meetings will be conducted on Microsoft Teams with an opportunity to attend in person at the Indiana Veterans' Center located at 777 North Meridian Street in Indianapolis and other selected locations.



Vanderburgh County service officer wins VFW award

EVANSVILLE - Paul Dupont, a dedicated member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, has been honored with the prestigious VFW James Butters Service Officer of the Year award for the state of Indiana. This welldeserved recognition celebrates Paul's unwavering commitment to serving his fellow veterans and his exceptional contributions as a service officer for Post 1114, located in Evansville.

Paul's service began when he served in the U.S. Army as a combat photographer from 1966 to 1969, bravely capturing moments in both Korea and Vietnam. Following his military service, he joined the VFW in January 1970 and his dedication to the organization's cause has been evident ever since.

Over the years, Paul has held several significant positions within the VFW, including commander from 1975 to 1976 as well as 1989 to 1990. He has also served intermittently as the member quartermaster since 1980, a position that he currently holds, overseeing the financial aspects of the post.

Paul was nominated for the award by Jerry Blake, the current post commander, and Roger Ferguson, the previous post commander. Jerry has known Paul for approximately 20 years, having met at VFW Post 1114, where they both hold membership. Jerry describes Paul as an easy-going individual who goes above and beyond to fulfill his responsibilities.

The VFW is here to help and to teach veterans without regards to their branch or service. If veterans need help, the VFW is there to help them. We help with family matters, we help with claims," said Jerry. "The mission of service officers, and the VFW, is to support veterans and Paul truly set himself apart by going above and beyond for them."

He emphasized that the post has been eagerly anticipating this honor, believing that Paul is one of the best service officers in the state.

Paul's outstanding qualifications for this recognition include successfully processing 98 VA claims and executing 40 powers of attorney for veterans in need over the course of 2022. This is Paul's second time receiving this accolade, having first been honored in 2019. In addition to his work with the VFW, he also serves as the quartermaster of the Veteran's Council of Vanderburgh County, which represents various veteran organizations such as the American Legion and Disabled American Veterans Charity.

In reflecting on his award, Paul humbly expressed his gratitude and the satisfaction he feels when he sees the positive impact his work has on veterans' lives. He acknowledged that while the job can be challenging, there are always veterans who genuinely appreciate the assistance.

"Knowing that I have made a difference makes it all worthwhile," Paul shared.

We would like to extend our heartfelt congratulations to Paul for being recognized as Indiana's VFW Service Officer of the Year.








Join us for our next installment of Journaling & Creativity Workshops to Inspire Guided Action.
