MEDAL Of HONOR*



The "Medal of Honor Memorial Highway" was officially named in October 2020 in northern Indiana. The renaming of the highway was unanimously approved by the Indiana House and Senate during the 2020 Indiana General Assembly, Highway 20 runs through seven counties in Indiana (Lake, Porter, LaPorte, St. Joseph, Elkhart, LaGrange, and Stueben). In Indiana the Medal of Honor Memorial Highway is approximately 156 miles long stretching from Illinois to Ohio. The total span extends from Oregon to Massachusetts and is 3,365 miles.

The Medal of Honor is the United States' highest award for actions that distinguishes servicemembers by go above and beyond the line of duty while serving in the military. It recognizes the bravery, courage, sacrifices, and integrity our men and women demonstrate while defending our country. According to the Congressional Medal of Honor Society there have been 3,534 total number of medals awarded. Nineteen recipients have been awarded twice. As of today, there are only 65 living recipients of the medal.

Facts regarding the Medal of Honor

- The youngest recipient, William Johnston, fought in the Civil War
- The first recipient was awarded to Jacob Parrott during the Civil War
- The only woman to receive the Medal of Honor is Mary E. Walker also during the Civil War
- 77% of Medal of Honors have been awarded to enlisted service members
- 23% of Medal of Honors have been awarded to officers

Indiana has had 60 medal of honor recipients. Most of those medals were awarded during the Civil War (17). Sammy Lee Davis, Indiana's only living recipient, was awarded the Medal of Honor for his heroic action which took place during the Vietnam War in November of 1967. He served in the US Army and at the time of his actions he was a Private First Class. Confronting enemy fire and ignoring severe pain from Injuries received from enemy mortar round explosion, Davis continued to fight back until the resistance from enemy was defeated.

The Medal of Honor Memorial Highway flag is now in Indiana and proudly on display at the Indiana Department of Veterans Affairs (IDVA) located at the Indiana Veterans' Center at 777 North Meridian St. in Indianapolis. The IDVA received the traveling flag from Illinois and we will continue its journey by handing it off to the next state, Ohio.





Blazer 88 Foundation was founded in the early spring of 2020 following the untimely passing of our dear son, brother, husband, father, and friend Chuck Theobald IV. Unbeknownst to many, one of Chuck's passions was supporting his fellow Veterans in their time of need, especially their mental well-being. Many times, a text or phone call from Chuck would simply say, "Gotta go to _____, someone needs my help, take care of the dogs." Those of us who knew, understood what he was doing.

The Blazer 88 Foundation has increased the quality of life for multiple veterans. The first event in 2020 raised over \$27k which was given to the Warrior Expeditions. This organization recognizes the therapeutic value of long-distance outdoor activities. Warrior Expeditions assist veterans transition from their wartime experiences.

The 2nd annual event in 2021 achieved more success raising \$37k! The Blazer 88 Foundation board met and chose to continue by allocating the money to not just one organization, instead assisting multiple veterans with any financial need they are having. A veteran in Tennessee is now able to get PTSD specific therapy, a young man who's parent died fighting for our freedoms is attending a camp that focuses on dealing with the grief of loss, an Army veteran facing eviction and unpaid utilities bills is now back on track, all thanks to very generous donations.



ELIGIBILITY FOR BURIAL

Military Discharge:

Veterans separated under conditions other than Dishonorable are eligible for burial.

National Guard & Reservist:

Must have been eligible for retirement pay at time of death.

Active Duty Death:

Service members who die on active duty, in the line of duty.

Surviving Spouse:

The surviving spouse of an eligible veteran can be buried at the IVMC.

The Child of a Veteran:

Child must be under age 21 or permanent dependent of the veteran.

- Outer burial container
- Monument
- Use of chape.
