FSSA – OMPP proposes to update the CMHW State Plan Benefit rate methodology so that a cost-ofliving increase may be applied annually at the discretion of the state until the next rate review to align with rate methodologies in Indiana's other home and community-based service waivers. This proposed change is projected to result in a decrease in annual aggregate expenditures.
