with them.

So, that's a summary of where we were for last month. You know, it pretty much entails everything that we've done, and we even have cases even broke down, finance, where we are, milestones. So, take time out when you get a chance to read over it. You'll be getting this on a pretty regular basis. So, once -- hopefully we'll have one ready to roll out again for next month, and that will start going out in your report.

Other than that, we seem to be on track.

We had our FEPA meeting with EEOC. That was

Monday, last Monday, myself, the Deputy Director,

our intake supervisor as well as our employment

supervisor attended this brief update, and

training was held over at the EEOC office on the

corner of Ohio Street and Illinois, so -- as you

know that we are contracted by EEOC to handle their cases, and just as -- our funder, so that's one of these required trainings that we need to

But other than that, we're moving forward.

I'm sure that we're constantly -- as Joan

mentioned earlier, we're watching our budget.

Everything is under scrutiny right now, so

from -- something we may want to do is get a

second- and third-look question at this

particular point.

So, right now we are still running a tight-ship budget and, you know, I'm always at the helm that -- once I talk to my good friends over at Budget -- Joan's buddies, I call them her buddies, you know, they say -- there's always something different, something they want.

So, this is where we are, you know. I guess we're just trying to make it work and trying to make sure that we have staff that's able to maintain and do what we need to get done, because we still have the responsibility of serving the public.

Then at 12:30, over in the Statehouse rotunda, we will have the State Employees Celebration, and the keynote speaker for that event will be Mayor James A. Young, who is the first African-American mayor of Philadelphia, Mississippi, where three civil rights workers were murdered back in 1964 by Klan members. So, we're looking forward to that.

We think both programs are going to be just -- we're going to hit them out of the park this year, and we're looking very forward to both of our speakers, so we would like to have all of you attend both events if you would like.

CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: Thank you very much. Look forward to it.

If there are no other announcements, I want to say it's been a good year, a lean year, and it looks like it's going to continue for a while, but I appreciate everybody's cooperation and support, especially in that I missed a few meetings this year, which is unusual for me, and I'm hoping that my schedule will be better next year, but I look forward to a new year, as I hope we all do, that things are going to be better.
