There are no Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order that we need to have action today, so we will go to an Administrative Update by our esteemed Deputy Director, Joshua.

MR. BREWSTER: Yes. Again, as I said, Jamal's not here, as he is taking care of his newborn and family, so I just have a brief report.

We will resume our CLE series. We have six planned this year again. The first will take place in West Lafayette in March. The topic for that three-hour course will be Civil Rights for People with Disabilities, and I will be presenting that, including issues regarding employment, housing, public accommodations, and education. We'll be working with the local human rights agencies to put that on as well as the Bar

Association there in Tippecanoe County.

Then we -- like I said, we have five others planned, basically every other month. I think we're going to Evansville, down to the New Albany area, Columbus, South Bend. We'll be in South Bend as part of the Consortium Conference in June.

Where else? Was that it?

MR. LANGE: I think that's it.

MR. BREWSTER: And one here in Indianapolis. So, those are -- have been well attended last year, so we'll continue those.

In April, other events, obviously we have the Holocaust Memorial, Youth Conference on April 17th, as well as the Day of Remembrance in the Statehouse that afternoon.

April 27th, we have tentatively scheduled a Fair Housing Month activity, which will also include some discussion on education and employment. This will be a virtual conference. We will have live attendees at the Ivy Tech here in Indianapolis, but we will also broadcast via the Internet throughout the state to the other

Ivy Tech campuses. 2 CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: When was 3 that? 4 MR. BREWSTER: That is tentatively 5 for April 27th. 6 CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: April what? 7 MR. BREWSTER: 27th. 8 CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: 27th. 9 COMM. CARTER: And what was the date 10 of the March -- the thing that --11 MR. BREWSTER: March 30th. 12 COMM. CARTER: 30th; okay. 13 MR. BREWSTER: It's a Friday morning. 14 CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: The subject 1.5 of the 27th? 16 MR. BREWSTER: Right now it's basically fair housing, education and employment. 17 We're probably going to somewhat replicate what 18 we did in Gary, Indiana last spring. We're going 19 20 to kind of just cover those three topics. We 21 will have probably speakers from EEOC or HUD, and 22 also what we did in Gary as far as the education 23 was kind of a round table. We had some

education -- people involved in education there, and then kind of talk about some issues surrounding education.

CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: Would you send me an e-mail --

MR. BREWSTER: Sure.

MR. BREWSTER: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: Thank you.

MR. BREWSTER: Other news, some press releases this month. We did some fair housing training in Indianapolis. Had a good turnout. I guess the biggest news was that we did receive a \$250,000 grant from HUD, to -- which we will be using to run some television and radio advertising in regards to fair housing throughout the state. We've also already developed some partnerships with Spanish media as well on that.

Also, we released the results of our survey that we conducted last year in regards to people's awareness of civil rights and the Civil Rights Commission. We released the results and

received some press coverage, including on WFYI, about that, the results basically indicating that there's still a lot of confusion about what are considered civil rights and what the Civil Rights Commission does.

I think the results showed, I believe, 60 percent or so of the respondents believe they have experienced discrimination. And if you want additional details on that report, it can be found on our Web site.

That's all I have.

CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: Okay. Thank you very much.

You have -- are there any announcements?

COMM. CRENSHAW: Yes. I received word that I was nominated and have been approved to receive an award as one of the White House's champions of change.

CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: Ooh

COMM. CRENSHAW: I'll be out in L.A. for a conference, and so myself as well as, I think, eight other people across the nation will be receiving this award.

CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: You go. 2 COMM. CRENSHAW: And we may have the 3 opportunity to meet the President at a -- near 4 future, so --5 CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: 6 That's fabulous. Congratulations. awesome. 7 COMM. CRENSHAW: Thank you. 8 CHAIRPERSON BLACKBURN: Any other 9 announcements? 10 (No response.) 11 COMM.
