Sherry Ogden versus Patriot Municipal Utility, I'd like to make a motion -- I'd like to make a 2 motion to reverse this case to probable cause, on 3 the basis of the company did not handle or either 4 follow proper procedure regarding dismissal of 5 its employee. 6 Question. COMM. BAYNARD: 7 COMM. CRENSHAW: Uh-huh. 8 COMM. BAYNARD: Is this a retaliation 9 case? 10 COMM. CRENSHAW: No, this is a sexual 11 harassment case -- or termination based upon sex. 12 COMM. LANGE: Procedurally speaking, we 19 do have to issue a notice of intention to 20 reverse --21 Okay. COMM. CRENSHAW: 22 MR. LANGE: And that goes out to the 23

parties, and Respondent gets an opportunity to respond. 2 COMM. CRENSHAW: So, then I make a 3 motion --4 MR. LANGE: And then they -- to issue 5 a notice that we do intend to reverse. 6 COMM. CRENSHAW: So, I'd like to make 7 a motion --8 That we intend --MR. LANGE: 9 COMM. CRENSHAW: -- that I intend to 10 reverse --11 MR. LANGE: -- to issue a notice of 12 intent --13 COMM. CRENSHAW: -- notice of intent 14 to reverse the decision. 15 CHAIRMAN CARTER: Okay. But we don't 16 vote on that. It would just --17 MR. Comm. Baynard? 1 COMM. BAYNARD: Yes. In the case of 2 Sherry Ogden versus Patriot Municipal Utility, I 3 would recommend to the Commission that we uphold 4 the Deputy Director's finding of no probable 5 cause. 6 CHAIRMAN CARTER: May I have a motion 7 to accept that recommendation? 8 COMM. RAMOS: So moved. 9 CHAIRMAN CARTER: Second? 10 COMM. CRENSHAW: Second. 11 CHAIRMAN CARTER: All in favor? 12 COMM. RAMOS: Aye. 13 COMM. CRENSHAW: Aye. 14 COMM. BAYNARD: Aye. 15 COMM. GIDNEY: Aye. 16 CHAIRMAN CARTER: Any opposed? 17 (No response.) 18 CHAIRMAN CARTER: Okay. Thank you. 19 New Business. Assignment of new appeals, 20 Comm. Crenshaw, if you would review Connie Brown 21 verses Patterson Logistic Services; I will review 22 Karey Coleman versus Shell Gas Station doing

business as Big K; and Comm. Baynard, Anthony McNair versus Richard L. Roudebush VAMC Hospital, 2 and Gina Stacey versus Wellstone Regional 3 Hospital; and Comm. Gidney, if you would review 4 Larry Artrip versus Wallick Construction Company, 5 Wallick Properties Midwest; and Comm. Ramos, 6 Maria Taylor versus Family Development Services, 7 those are two case, both with the same name, 8 different numbers. Thank you. 9 Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and 10 Order, there are five cases. May I have a motion 11 to accept those five cases, please? 12 COMM. GIDNEY: So moved. 13 COMM. CRENSHAW: Second. 14 CHAIRMAN CARTER: All in favor? 15 COMM. RAMOS: Aye. 16 COMM. CRENSHAW: Aye. 17 COMM. BAYNARD: Aye. 18 COMM. GIDNEY: Aye. 19 CHAIRMAN CARTER: Any opposed? 20 (No response.) 21 Thank you. CHAIRMAN CARTER: 22 There are no Consent Agreements, which 23

then brings us to the Administrative Update.

MR. BREWSTER: Well, just a few things. We did have some coverage in the media recently about a case with probable cause involving a service animal in training that was allegedly denied access to a gas station in Indianapolis. I think it's important that we are getting some coverage on disability issues and the rights of people to have access to places of public accommodation, housing, employment, et cetera, so that was good.

Let's see. Of course, we -- as of

July 1st, we have now four cultural commissions

housed within our agency. The Commission on

Hispanic and Latino Affairs, Danny Lopez, the

Executive Director, he's actually been over there

for probably a year or more now.

But in addition to him, we now have -- and this was by statute, House Enrolled Act
No. 1002 -- put the Indiana Commission for Women in our office as well as the Indiana Native
American Indian Affairs Commission, which currently has no director. I don't believe they

actually have a full commission at this point. Indiana Commission on Social Status of Black Males, Mr. James Garrett, Executive Director, is -- they're now housed within our office, so that seems to be going well.

COMM. RAMOS: Ms. Garvey is there, too?

MR. BREWSTER: Yes, yes, the --Mr. Garrett and Kristin Garvey are both in our office, and they have -- all of our -- we're working to rearrange things to make them comfortable there.

(Mr. Smith arrived.)

MR. BREWSTER: As far as outreach activities, you kind of have a list of what we did there. In July, this past week, we had the Governor's reception for the Indiana Black Expo, the employment opportunity fair is ongoing. were also the presenting sponsor at the Statewide Education Conference yesterday, and Jamal, I believe, and some others are over currently at the corporate luncheon.

> MS. RINCONES-CHAVEZ: He just came

in. 2 MR. BREWSTER: Oh, there he is. I 3 guess not; he's in the room. CHAIRMAN CARTER: He hasn't left the 4 5 building. 6 MR. BREWSTER: Okay. Next month we 7 have some fair housing training in Terre Haute. We also have a CLE here, I think it's actually on 8 9 the same day as our Commission meeting, August 24th. It will be in this same facility, 10 11 in one of these rooms, about -- in cooperation 12 with the Department of Education, the civil 13 rights in education. No --Mr. Smith, do you have anything to add on 14 15 that? 16 MR. SMITH: I'm not sure if you mentioned the cultural commissions. 17 18 MR. BREWSTER: Yes. 19 MR. SMITH: Outreach. That's it. 20 COMM. RAMOS: Did he say Colts Commission or cultural? 21 22 MR. BREWSTER: Cultural. MR. SMITH: Cultural. That was that 23

one. 2 MR. LANGE: We won't get the Colts Commission. 3 4 CHAIRMAN CARTER: If these cases 5 start coming in with service dogs, not just dogs, 6 though, the new -- the 2010 revision of the ADA 7 includes a greater latitude of service animals, 8 including a special section for miniature horses. 9 MR. BREWSTER: Yes. I haven't seen 10 any. 11 (Mr. Smith departed.) 12 CHAIRMAN CARTER: That will complicate life for some people. 13 MR. BREWSTER: I haven't seen any 14 cases on miniature horses yet, though. 15 CHAIRMAN CARTER: I don't know how 16 17 that got in there or where it is that --MR. BREWSTER: It's the enlarged 18 miniature horse lobby. 19 20 CHAIRMAN CARTER: It must be. Thank 21 you. 22 MR. LANGE: Not a great difference between a horse -- a miniature horse and a dog. 23

CHAIRMAN CARTER: Not in size. 1 2 MR. LANGE: No. CHAIRMAN CARTER: But in -- I don't 3 I don't know how easy it is to housebreak 4 a horse. 5 MR. LANGE: I don't either. 6 MR. BREWSTER: What about their feet? 7 Do you like put shoes on them, like a normal 8 9 horse? CHAIRMAN CARTER: Sneakers, so they 10 don't scuff up the floor. 11 (Laughter.) 12 COMM. RAMOS: And they're trained to 13 assist people? 14 CHAIRMAN CARTER: Yeah. 15 MR. LANGE: Yeah, they're trained to 16 17 be --CHAIRMAN CARTER: There's more to 18 service dogs than just guide dogs for the blind. 19 COMM. RAMOS: Sure. 20 CHAIRMAN CARTER: There are dogs that 21 are trained to recognize the onset of seizure 22 disorder. 23

COMM. RAMOS: Uh-huh.

MR. BREWSTER: But I think with that case, it was important to note that that law covers not just service animals that are trained, but service animals that are being trained.

CHAIRMAN CARTER: Being trained.

MR. BREWSTER: And that includes also employment. There's some -- our own statute requires that employees -- or employers allow employees who are training service animal to have them in the place, even if that employee's not disabled.

CHAIRMAN CARTER: Well, yeah, that -there's an interesting wrinkle to the third part
of the definition of disability is a person who's
perceived as having a disability. If a person is
acting in the roll of a person with a disability
for training purposes --

MR. BREWSTER: Right.

CHAIRMAN CARTER: -- that's a kind of perception.

MR. BREWSTER: Yeah, I suppose.

MR. LANGE: It would be easy to

perceive such a person as disabled. 1 2 CHAIRMAN CARTER: You have to wait for the case -- well, I know when we have taken 3 people out, like public works people in 4 wheelchairs for an awareness thing and making 5 them go up and down the curb cuts that they 6 themselves built. 7 8 MR. LANGE: Uh-huh. CHAIRMAN CARTER: When they've done 9 it bad, they -- one of the things they all said 10 was that suddenly they realized that people were 11 looking at them and the people didn't know they 12 13 weren't really required to be in a wheelchair, so they felt different about --14 Being looked at? 15 MR. LANGE: CHAIRMAN CARTER: -- being in a 16 wheelchair than they thought they would. 17 Okay. Any other questions about the 18 Administrative Update or anything else? 19 (No response.) 20 CHAIRMAN CARTER: Announcements? 21

CHAIRMAN CARTER: I would like to

announce that I believe this Friday, but in any 2 case, the 26th, which is in six days -- that wouldn't be Friday, would it? 3 Thursday. 4 MR. LANGE: CHAIRMAN CARTER: Thursday is the 5 6 22nd anniversary of the ADA, speaking of. COMM. RAMOS: Isn't that something? 7 Time flies. 8 CHAIRMAN CARTER: It's '12, and it 9 was signed in '0 --10 MR. LANGE: It went into effect 11 in '92. 12 CHAIRMAN CARTER: '92. 13 14 COMM. RAMOS: Are there any events 15 planned? CHAIRMAN CARTER: Well, there are 16 sporadic -- there's nothing that I know of, no 17 official thing, but I think there will probably 18 be a Presidential proclamation and various 19 proclamations around. 20 In Bloomington we're doing the whole week, 21 the whole next week -- we had sent a bunch of 22 23 students -- a faculty member at IU volunteered

his students for doing surveys of businesses, and we sent them out and have a thing, a survey form, that they fill out, and a lot of what they came back with was ambiguous, and so we figured we'd have a week of service to solve the ambiguities.

So, we have a new list of the same sites with what was ambiguous about what the students found, and then we have a bunch of people who are going to be going out with someone who knows what they're doing and look and see if indeed -- well, one of the biggest problems is, for instance, the students will say, "well, they're van accessible, and handicap parking doesn't say "van accessible."

And we maintain that if the parking space is properly done, if there's an eight-foot access aisle as well as an eight-foot parking space, there's an upright sign with the symbol on it, that the absence of what I have found out is a five-dollar white sign that says "van accessible" is really not that big a crime, you know.

It is a proper handicap parking space, properly van accessible, it just doesn't have the

sign that says it is, and the people who need it recognize it as such, and so we're not going to penalize them for that. So, we have to see if that's the case when the students have said that it wasn't, because they tend to be letter of the law, which we probably should be in a world that operates that way, but it doesn't.

Okay. Anyone else?

(No response.)

CHAIRMAN CARTER: Otherwise, we are going, going, gone. Adjourned.

MR. LANGE: But for signatures.

CHAIRMAN CARTER: Except for signatures, and observe the oncoming, onrushing meeting dates.
