MADAME CHAIR BLACKBURN: All right. It's not listed on my agenda. Thank you very much.

The Administrative Update and the Director's Report.

DIRECTOR SCOTT: Yes. As you noticed, the Commission has directed us, and we have been involved in the Education Initiative, and we have provided reports to the Commission, and in part, realizing the Executive Session for some of that information, but we have no actions to be taken, no matters to be voted on today regarding that initiative. And we will have an agenda item involving the introduction of the members of the support staff who will be working in that area at the next meeting.

The second area is to welcome our new Commissioner, Commissioner Stephen Ramos. It is good to have you on board, and we appreciate the fact that IBM has allowed you to serve as a Member

of the Commission. And for those who are not aware of some of the Commissioner's background, which I think is really important for the Commission, in his work with IBM -- I know I'm using a phrase that you have not provided me, but I would call him a futurist.

And some of his work involves determining the impact of decisions that are made looking at what would happen if A is chosen versus B and those alternatives and the impact that it could have on, certainly, IBM's business and its activities. And I think that attribute is one that is very welcome here in the Commission to assist us if we have cause to make recommendations to the Legislature or the Governor's Office as the statute authorizes, to be able to provide that kind of insight and assist the other Commissioners who have done so well in the past providing that kind of information.

So I thank you for serving after going through the experience of the Governor's Office and being cleared to become an appointee.

COMMISSIONER RAMOS: Thank you very much. I look forward to it.

DIRECTOR SCOTT: Thank you. And with that I

think I'm going to hold the announcements until after the Deputy Director speaks.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR DeBACA: With regard to our pending case inventory, we have a total of 470 pending cases. During the month of August we had one probable cause finding. In July we had reported 452 pending cases. There have been 57 additions to that inventory, and 38 are dispositions or cases closed since then and thus 470 -- I apologize, 471 pending cases.

With regard to ADR, during the month of August ten cases resulted in successful settlements, and in addition to monetary benefits in the amount of \$9,720 complainants also received other benefits such as respondents agreeing to attend Fair Housing training and other types of dispositions.

And that is it.

DIRECTOR SCOTT: And actually, Madame Chair, there is one other matter that I would like to take note of. The staff, under the direction of the Deputy Director, conducted an audit of our files and our records, and in the course of several weeks Ms. DeBaca with other members of the staff actually engaged in an eye-ball I which resulted in a closure of a significant number of

cases that had previously been completed but had not been fully closed and also gave us comfort in knowing that the files we have, we have, and the cases that we have, we have files for.

Again, also in assisting in that regard, that has been very helpful for us in having a comfort that we are proceeding in the, "proper manner," with respect to these files, and I would like to publically thank the Deputy Director for her effort in marshalling the staff and resources and the help of those members who are also here, including Joan Essex and Barbara and also Debra in that work, which was in our view very important work in having the Commissioners handling the cases remain current and continuing to be current.

So thank you.

MADAME CHAIR BLACKBURN: In that we have dismissed the motions and orders for August in the previous statements I want to make sure that we dismiss the orders and motions for September. There were 25 cases of no probable cause, five of failure to cooperate or to locate and 20 cases that were withdrawn with settlement or consent agreements, and no cases over which we lacked jurisdiction.

But I would like a motion to dismiss those cases.

COMMISSIONER CARTER: So moved.

COMMISSIONER BAYNARD: Second.

MADAME CHAIR BLACKBURN: All in favor?

(Unanimous response.)

MADAME CHAIR BLACKBURN: Thank you. A couple of announcements before we conclude.

There is in an invitation from HUD for the Director and one of the Commissioners to go for an open-house in Washington -- or an open-house in Washington at the training academy, and it's at the National Fair Housing Training Academy. It is scheduled for October 3rd, and I told the Director that I will try to go, but I need to look at my schedule. So I'm announcing it so that you are all on notice that if I can't go one of you may be called to see if you can go.

DIRECTOR SCOTT: As I mentioned, in that facility that I'm making reference to, our staff has had the benefit of that training and traveled to Washington, DC. There are several stages of the program, and they are on their return recorded. There are certain benefits in the training and we appreciate that support, and it's

another relationship opportunity in terms of our dealings with HUD. So that hopefully we can continue to provide the contracts and the payments that the agency receives for our work in the housing cases.

MADAME CHAIR BLACKBURN: On a personal note the academy has been operating in some temporary quarters awaiting the renovation of one of the buildings on the main campus of Howard University, which is my alma mater, and the ribbon cutting is going to occur in the primary auditorium, one of my old haunts. So I hope I'll be able to go.

MS. ESSEX: One thing I wanted to mention with regard to the training in Washington, it also has allowed staff members that handle the housing cases to become certified for handling those cases, which is something new, and I think it helps the investigators feel that they have the proper training that they need on a National level as well as a local level. So it's been very beneficial for them.

MADAME CHAIR BLACKBURN: Are there any other announcements?

DIRECTOR SCOTT: Yes. I have a couple other announcements which I deferred until after the

Deputy Director had spoken.

One in particular is we had received a first invitation from the Chief Justice to participate in one of the Court's programs regarding certified interpreters and creation of a certified interpreter registry in which the Deputy Director and the Director both attended, and we received thanks again from the Chief Justice afterwards in terms of the support that the Commission is providing to that program.

In addition I would like the Commissioners to note that we have scheduled six dates covering three years for the MLK, Jr. holiday celebration, which for 2006 will be Thursday, January 12th, for 2007 it will be Thursday, January 11th and for 2008, Thursday, January 17th. And as you know we always look forward to having the Commissioners participate as we do with these dates as well.

And then as you may recall, the Commission of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Commission also hosts the Holocaust observance, and the dates have been set for the next three years, Tuesday, April 25th in 2006, Tuesday, April 17th in 2007 and Tuesday, April 29th in 2008.

MADAME CHAIR BLACKBURN: Would you repeat the

date for this coming January for the MLK celebration?

DIRECTOR SCOTT: Yes. Thursday, January, 12th.

MADAME CHAIR BLACKBURN: Thank you.

DIRECTOR SCOTT: And in addition, while I have not received the final written letter, I wanted to mention that the agency has been commended by EEOC regarding a review of HUD, regarding a review of our operations and our offices and files that are being done, and we are awaiting a letter. But having been so commended at least I wanted to let the Commission be aware of that in terms of the work that the staff has been doing, and we do have good staff who do well on behalf of the Commission.

And I believe that concludes the announcements that I have.

MADAME CHAIR BLACKBURN: I'd like to announce that the first fund-raising event for the Indiana Museum of African American History will be held February 4th at the Weston Hotel, and tickets are \$150 a piece, And there are corporate tables available at the 25 and 3500 level.

And on a personal note, your Chair is being honored with the Hope Award on December 7th and

1 being honored by the Fashion Group International 2 on October 21st, and I don't know the name of the 3 award. 4 DIRECTOR SCOTT: May we obtain some more 5 detailed information from you regarding that? MADAME CHAIR BLACKBURN: I'm sure I can follow 6 7 up on that. Thank you. 8 DIRECTOR SCOTT: If the Commission is able to have -- if they are interested in African American 9 10 Museum history event it certainly would be on an 11 individual basis and no compulsion from the office, obviously, but if we do have enough to get 12 13 a table is there a way that the Commission can be 14 represented? 15 MADAME CHAIR BLACKBURN: Absolutely.
