Please find attached two Metropolitan Planning Organization TIP amendments which must be approved and included into the FY 2012 State Transportation Improvement Program. We will reflect by reference the 2012 – 2015 federal aid projects covered by this approval in our 2012 - 2015 STIP. The amendment is for the Tippecanoe County Area Plan Commission (Lafayette MPO) and the Northern Indiana Regional Planning Commission (NIRPC). 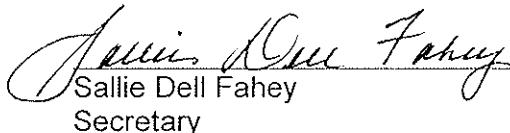

FY 2012-2015 TIP Amendments  
**CityBus, County Highway Department, and IDNR**

**Staff Report**  
**August 11, 2011**

**BACKGROUND AND REQUEST:**

Several requests are included in this TIP amendment. CityBus requests an amendment to program a trade of local funds for federal funds and revise its 2011 operating and capital list of projects. The Tippecanoe County Highway Department requests additional HSIP funds for the North 9<sup>th</sup> Street/Burnett's Road and Tyler Road projects. Finally, the Indiana Department of Natural Resources requests programming additional federal funds for the extension of the Wabash Heritage Trail within Prophetstown State Park.

*CityBus*

a) CityBus has made an arrangement with the Michiana Area Council of Governments, MACOG, to trade \$1,000,000 of their federal transit Section 5307 funds for \$500,000 in CityBus local funds. Unlike CityBus, the Elkhart-Goshen transit system is unable to use its full allocation of federal funds. Instead of returning them to the Federal Trust Fund, the trade keeps the federal funds in the state and allows CityBus additional funds for operating and capital expenses.

The CityBus Board of Directors approved the transfer on April 14, 2011.

b) With the additional federal funds, CityBus has requested adjustments to their CY 2011 Section 5307 operating and capital expenditures. The following tables summarize the changes:

A portion of the new federal funds, \$500,000, will be used for operating expenses. This allows CityBus to reduce the amount of local funds needed and those local funds will be used to help construct the downtown transfer center.

The balance of the additional federal funds will be used for capital items. CityBus reviewed its 2011 project list and has decided to forgo two projects and pursue two others. The two projects being removed are: Acquire Property / A&E Demolition (project 12), and Adjacent Property Excavation and Fill (project 13). The two replacement projects are: Architectural Design, Engineering, Demolition and Construction of Bus Storage Area and the purchase of one fixed route replacement bus.

The following justification was provided by CityBus for the new projects:

**A & E AND DEMOLITION & CONSTRUCTION BUS STORAGE - \$636,996**

CityBus operations have grown in size to where additional bus storage is seriously needed to safely manage and store the number of buses in the present location. The project would require an addition to the current building on property currently owned by GLPTC. The budget for A & E work, demo the asphalt, fill the area to required level and construct the expansion of the storage building for this line item is \$636,996.

**PURCHASE OF ONE (1) 40 FT FIXED ROUTE HYBRID BUS - \$625,000**

Because of the age and condition of the current buses in the fleet, CityBus desires to replace one (1) full size 40' transit bus. The bus being replaced is over 12 years in age, and meets the guidelines outlined in FTA Circular 9030.1A. The bus being replaced is # 1001. It was manufactured by GILLIG in 1998. The proposed budget for this line item is \$625,000.

The CityBus Board of Directors approved the changes at its June 22, 2011 board meeting.

Tippecanoe County Highway Department - HSIP Safety Projects

The county is seeking an additional \$100,000 in HSIP funds for the North 9<sup>th</sup> Street and Burnett's Road intersection improvement project. The additional funds will be used for construction and construction inspection. The total amount of HSIP funds for the project increases to \$945,658. The updated amounts are:

With the additional federal funds, the benefit to cost ratio is 1.07 which is above the minimum for use of federal funds.

The County is also seeking an additional \$164,459 in HSIP funds for the Tyler Road project. The additional funds will be used for full depth patching. The updated amounts are:

The total amount of HSIP funds for the project increases to \$1,433,459 and the new benefit to cost ratio is 1.56.

*Indiana Department of Natural Resources (IDNR)*

---

In 2009, the IDNR was awarded \$746,500 in federal enhancement funds to extend the Wabash Heritage Trail within Prophetstown State Park. The trails extension is 3.1 miles in length and extends the trail eastward to Pretty Prairie Road (near the Tippecanoe River) and westward to the gate house. Even though INDOT awarded federal funds for the trails extension, it was not enough to fully fund the project. The project des number is 0810383.

---

On July 7<sup>th</sup>, 2011, INDOT awarded an additional \$490,791 in enhancement funds to the project. It is now fully funded with federal and state funds. The total cost of construction is \$1,546,614, with a federal share of \$1,237,291. The state's portion is \$309,323. Construction is anticipated to begin in 2012/2013.

The Technical Transportation Committee reviewed the amendments at its July 20, 2011 meeting and recommended adoption to the Area Plan Commission.

The Administrative Committee reviewed the amendments at its August 2, 2011 meeting and recommended adoption to the Area Plan Commission.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends approval of these amendments to the FY 2012-2015 Transportation Improvement Program by adoption of the attached Resolution T-11-05.

On August 17, 2011, the Area Plan Commission of Tippecanoe County amended the FY 2012-2015 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) by Resolution T-11-05. The Greater Lafayette Public Transportation Corporation, CityBus, the County Highway Department and the Indiana Department of Natural Resources requested the amendments. The amendments include: 1) Programming a trade of local funds for Section 5307 federal funds; 2) Revising the 2011 operating and capital list of projects; 3) Programming additional HSIP safety funds for the North 9<sup>th</sup> Street and Tyler Road projects; and 4) Programming additional STP Enhancement funds for the extension of the Wabash Heritage Trail within Prophetstown State Park.

By this letter, I am administratively amending the TIP as well. The anticipated year for various phases of eleven local projects was updated from 2011 to 2012. The projects include: Concord Rd. & Maple Point Ext. (CN phase, Des #0800256), Old Romney Rd. (PE phase, local project), South 18<sup>th</sup> St. (RW phase, Des #1172009), Veterans Memorial Parkway (PE phase, local project), Happy Hollow (RW phase, Des #0900002), North 9<sup>th</sup> St. (CN phase, Des #1006056), North St. & Railroad St. (PE & RW phases, Des #1172413 & 1005755), Dayton Rd. at College (CN phase, Des #1006069), and Sign Replacement in Battle Ground, Dayton and Clarks Hill (CN phase, Des #1006068, 1006063 & 1006067).

## RESOLUTION 11-18

### A RESOLUTION OF THE NORTHWESTERN INDIANA REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION AMENDING THE 2012-2015 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR LAKE, PORTER, AND LAPORTE COUNTIES, INDIANA

#### AMENDMENT NO. 1

August 18, 2011

**WHEREAS**, Northwest Indiana's citizens require a safe, efficient, effective, resource-conserving regional transportation system that maintains and enhances regional mobility and contributes to improving the quality of life in Northwest Indiana; and

**WHEREAS**, the Northwestern Indiana Regional Planning Commission, hereafter referred to as "the Commission", being designated the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Lake, Porter and LaPorte County area, has established a regional, comprehensive, cooperative, and continuing (3-C) transportation planning process to develop the unified planning work program, a transportation plan, and a transportation improvement program to facilitate federal funding for communities, counties, and transit operators, and to provide technical assistance and expertise to regional transportation interests; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission performs the above activities to satisfy regional requirements under the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1962, as amended, the Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1978, as amended, the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended, the Rail Reorganization Act of 1973, the 1970 Clean Air Act, as amended, the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991, the Transportation Equity Act for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century, and the Safe, Accountable, Flexible and Efficient Transportation Equity Act—A Legacy for Users (2005), as well as other federal, state and local laws mandating transportation planning activities; and

**WHEREAS**, the FY 2012-2015 Transportation Improvement Program is a product of a multi-modal, 3-C transportation planning process, compatible with regional goals and objectives and socio-economic and demographic factors used to form the *2040 Comprehensive Regional Plan (CRP)*; and

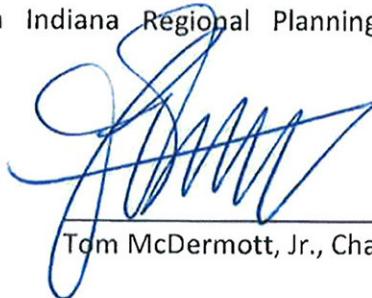
**WHEREAS**, the FY 2012-2015 Transportation Improvement Program is an implementation of the *2040 Comprehensive Regional Plan (CRP)*; is fiscally constrained, and is consistent with the State Implementation Plan for Air Quality; and

**WHEREAS**, the FY 2012-2015 Transportation Improvement Program is developed by the Commission in coordination and cooperation with local elected and appointed highway and transit officials, special interest and service organizations, including users of public transit, the Indiana Department of Transportation, the Indiana Department of Environmental Management, the U.S. Federal Highway Administration, the U.S. Federal Transit Administration, and the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency; and

**WHEREAS**, the changes to the FY 2012-2015 Transportation Improvement Program brought about by this amendment were reviewed by the Air Quality Conformity Task Force's Interagency Consultation Group (ICG).

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Northwestern Indiana Regional Planning Commission hereby amends the 2012-2015 Transportation Improvement Program by adding the new projects and making other changes as shown on the attachment to this resolution.
